## **Private Pilot Glider Cost Estimate**

Memphis Soaring Society - Based on 2021 Rates/Costs

**The following is only an estimate. Different people will require differing amounts of training.** This estimate assumes that you are an ab initio student starting with no aviation experience. Transition pilots coming from the airplane world require less training and the FAA requirements are different. The following example assumes that you fly 2 to 3 flights every weekend for 6 months.

Past experiences have shown that the total cost has a range from approximately \$3,000 - \$8,000 (the average is about \$4,600) and depends upon the following variables:

- Frequency of Lessons: If you are able take two to three flights every weekend and you are motivated to study, your progress will be faster, more efficient and less expensive.
- Weather: Sometimes the weather is not cooperative.
- Instructor availability: Instructor and FAA examiner schedules can limit your progress.
- Age: Motivated people that are willing to "hit the books" tend to learn the necessary flying skills and knowledge more easily.
- **Simulator:** Experience has shown that simulator work helps training. Many of the people at the lower end of the price range had extensive simulator exposure. Condor Flight Simulator is one such example and MSS has one in the clubhouse, free to members to use for practice and training before going flying. Link http://www.condorsoaring.com
